Subject:- Grant of Extended Permission to Sangam Sevabhavi Trust's Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Nashik-Pune Highway, Sangamner, Dist.- Ahilyanagar-422605, Maharashtra (AYU0150) with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 15 seats in 03 PG courses in the subject namely (1) Kayachikitsa -05 seats (2) Prasuti & stri roga-05 seats (3) Shalakya Tantra-05 seats (Opted for Shalakya Tantra Netra Roga Chikitsa-03 seats and Shalakya tanytra Karna, Nasa and Mukha Roga Chikitsa-02 seats) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26-reg.

## Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely to Sangam Sevabhavi Trust's Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Nashik-Pune Highway, Sangamner, Dist.- Ahilyanagar-422605, Maharashtra (AYU0150) inspection was conducted on 08.04.2025 and 09.04.2025 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Asessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 15 seats in 03 PG courses in the subject namely (1) Kayachikitsa -05 seats (2) Prasuti & stri roga-05 seats (3) Shalakya Tantra-05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- 2) As per the Regulation no. 04 of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda, Regulations, 2024 published on 01st October, 2024 there shall be 18 Postgraduate programs in Ayurveda on and from the date of publication of the said Regulations shalakya Tantra Postgraduate program has been divided into Shalakya- Netra Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Ophthalmology) & Shalakya- Karna, Naasa and Mukha Raga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Oto-Rhino Laryngology and same was informed to you vide letter Ref. No.-3/2025/MARB/General Matters dated 05.05.2025 and 10.06.2025. In response of the same you have sent an email dated 27.06.2025 enclosing the letter vide ref no. S.S.T.AYU./557/2025 dated 27.06.2025 in which for 05 seats of Shalakya Tantra you have opted for Shalakya-Netra Roga Chikitsa-03 seats and Shalakya-Karna, Mukha & Nasa Roga-02 seats
- 3) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-

1. Teaching staffs:-

a) Availability of total teaching staff for UG ( BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college is  $\frac{Available}{Required} x100\% = \frac{29}{30} x100\% = 96.67\%$  (Excluding Excess).

b) Shortcoming is as under-

4) The assessment report was duly placed in the 134th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 16.07.2025 and Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations but fulfilling the criteria for issuance of extended permission in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Hence, the Board decided to issue extended permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 15 seats in 03 PG courses for the academic year 2025-26 as the college has been permitted consecutively for previous three years after fulfilling the conditions as specified in the concerned Regulations.

## "DECISION"

5) Therefore, Extended permission is hereby granted to Sangam Sevabhavi Trust's Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Nashik-Pune Highway, Sangamner, Dist.- Ahilyanagar-422605, Maharashtra (AYU0150) with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and 15 seats in 03 PG courses in accordance with Regulation 15 (5) of MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024 in the subject namely (1) Kayachikitsa -05 seats (2) prasuti & stri roga-05 seats (3) Shalakya Tantra-05 seats (Opted for Shalakya Tantra Netra Roga Chikitsa-03 seats and Shalakya tanytra Karna, Nasa and Mukha Roga Chikitsa-02 seats) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic year 2025-26 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcoming shall be fulfilled along with the following conditions:-

- I. Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and Minimum 15% of Postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 15 seats in 03 PG courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatary Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 1) Admissions made in violation of the abové conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 2) Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 3) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 4) Compliance of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.
- 5) The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-
  - All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
  - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.

All the requirements of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda, Regulations, 2024,

All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate iv) Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.

The shortcoming mentioned in para no. 3.

6) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session, 2026, 27.1 (4)
